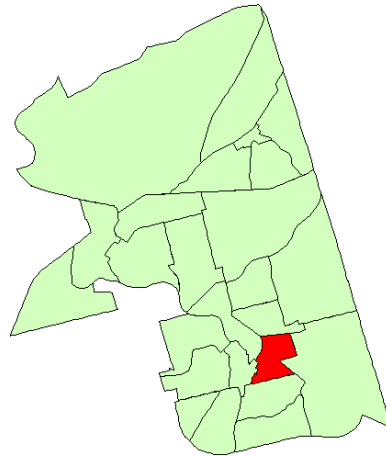


A Demographic Profile of the Lincoln Oaks Planning Neighbourhood

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The following tables provide data from the 2001 and 2006 Canadian censuses for the Lincoln Oaks planning neighbourhood and for the City of Cambridge as a whole. This information will be of value to community stakeholders, including health and social service organizations, to inform planning and identify priority areas. These tables were produced by the Social Planning Council of Cambridge and North Dumfries based on Statistics Canada Census data provided through the Community Social Data Strategy (CSDS).

PLANNING NEIGHBOURHOOD HIGHLIGHTS – LINCOLN OAKS

1. Population growth and age distribution

- In 2006 there were 4580 residents in the Lincoln Oaks neighbourhood, or approximately 4% of the population of Cambridge.
- The total population decreased by 7.1% between 2001 and 2006, compared to an increase of 9.1% for the city as a whole.
- Between 2001 and 2006 the population aged 5-9 experienced the greatest decrease (34.6%) and the population aged 55-64 experienced the greatest increase (10.4%).

2. Housing

- The total number of dwellings decreased slightly between 2001 and 2006 with the proportion of owner occupied dwellings increasing and the proportion of rented dwellings decreasing. The renter to owner composition in 2006 was 38% to 62% compared with a ratio of 26% to 74% for the city as a whole.
- Between 2001 and 2006 there was an increase in the percentage of rented occupied private dwellings paying more than 30% of their household income on rent. During the same period there was a decrease in the number of owner occupied households paying more than 30% of household income on major payments.

3. Families

- Between 2001 and 2006 the proportion of couple families and lone parent families remained relatively constant (79% to 21%).
- There were a higher percentage of households led by lone parents than for the city as a whole. The proportion of female headed lone parent families increased between 2001 and 2006 while the proportion of male headed lone parent families decreased.
- The average number of children at home (1.1) was slightly lower than for the city as a whole (1.2).

4. Seniors Living Arrangements

- In 2006 the proportion of seniors in Lincoln Oaks was higher (14.0%) than for the city as a whole (10.3%).
- Between 2001 and 2006 there was an increase in the number of seniors living alone.

5. Home Language, Mother Tongue, and Visible Minorities

- The proportion of people reporting a non-official home language doubled between 2001 and 2006 (from 5.1% to 10.3%).
- The most common non-official home languages were Portuguese, Spanish, Pashto, Farsi, Polish and Greek.
- The proportion of visible minorities was lower in this planning neighbourhood (5.7%) than the city as a whole (11.1%). The top three visible minorities were South Asian, Latin American and West Asian.

6. Mobility

- Neighbourhood stability refers to the average length of tenure among residents. Less turnover equals greater neighbourhood stability. In 2006 there were more people in Lincoln Oaks who had changed residence within the past year (16.6%) than in the city as a whole (13.4%).

7. Amount of Income, Low Income and Incidence of Low Income

- Both average census family income and average employment income increased from 2001 to 2006. However, incomes were lower than for the city as a whole.
- The proportion of people with employment income went up during this period; however, it was still lower than for the city as a whole.
- The incidence of low income in economic families (12.2%) was higher than for the city as a whole (7.8%).

8. Labour Force Participation

- The unemployment rate for youth aged 15-24 decreased from 13.5% in 2001 to 12.0% in 2006. The unemployment rate for people 25 years and older also decreased (from 8.2% to 3.4%).
- There was an increase in the number of females with children participating in the labour force between 2001 and 2006.

9. Education (population over age 15)

- In 2006 there were proportionately fewer people in Lincoln Oaks who held a certificate, diploma, or degree (66.0%) than in the city as a whole (72.6%).
